On September 25, we served 63 families, or 205 individuals (88 adults, 48 children, and 69 seniors).

#### **CROP Hunger Walk**

The Shallotte/South Brunswick 30th CROP Hunger Walk will be held on Sunday, November 7, from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. There will be two routes - Mulberry Park to Main Street to Village Road to Calvary Church and return to Mulberry Park, or a shorter walk around Mulberry Park for those who are unable to walk the longer distance. Event forms have been submitted to the Town of Shallotte and the police. Recruiter letters were sent to the churches.
